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CHAPTER 1 - BASIC PROMPT ENGINEERING

1.1 Introduction to Prompt Engineering

Prompt engineering is the process of asking the right question of your AI tool. You can divide this process into the following 6 areas, using the acronym **COURSE** to help remember them:

Area	Details
<u>C</u> ontext	The more detail you can give your AI tool on the question you want answering, the better the answer is likely to be.
<u>O</u> utput	Do you want your AI tool to present its answer as free text, bullet points, a table, a spreadsheet or in some other format?
<u>A</u> udience	Who should be the intended readership of the answer to your question?
<u>R</u> ole	What persona do you want your AI tool to adopt when answering the question?
<u>S</u> tyl	Do you want your AI tool to answer using flowery English, concise language, legalese, jargon or textspeak?
<u>E</u> xamples	Can you provide examples of what you're looking for, to guide your AI tool down the right path?

The rest of this chapter shows how to control each of these aspects of your conversation with ChatGPT (the techniques work for all the main AI tools, as we'll see later in this courseware).



The best way to think of an AI tool like ChatGPT is as a personal assistant who will adopt any persona you specify, and answer questions using any style and output format you request.

1.2 Context

You will get better answers from your AI tool if you can provide it with background to your question. Consider these 3 levels of context:


Level of context	Prompt	Response
<i>Minimal</i>	“Come up with 3 reasons why we shouldn't get a pet cat for our daughter”	<p>Here are three reasons why you might reconsider getting a pet cat for your daughter:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Allergies: If anyone in the home has allergies to cats, this could lead to ongoing health issues, including sneezing, itching, and more severe reactions, which can be quite uncomfortable. 2. Come up with 3 reasons which might persuade Amy why you shouldn't buy a cat.”	<p>Here are three reasons you might explain to Amy about why getting a cat might not be the best idea right now:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Travel Limitations: “Amy, getting a cat would mean we have to think about who will take care of it whenever we want to go on holiday. It can be hard to find someone to look after a cat, and we love our family trips!” 2. Care Responsibilities: “Cats need a lot of care, like feeding, cleaning their litter box, and playtime. With how busy we all are, it might be tough for us to give a cat all the attention it deserves.” 3. Furniture Concerns: “Cats can sometimes scratch furniture like sofas and carpets, especially if they don't have enough things to scratch. We'd have to be very careful about our things getting damaged, and fixing them can be expensive and time-consuming.”
<i>Detailed</i>	“Your parents used to have a cat, and you remember what a pain it was: always scratching the furniture and carpets, never there when you needed to go on holiday and expensive to feed and look after (plus you hated having to change its litter tray). Your nine-year-old daughter now wants to get a cat, but you know that you'll spend most time looking after it. You want to persuade her that buying a cat is a bad idea, but being only 9 years old you know that adult arguments won't work. Come up with 3 arguments to convince your daughter that buying a cat would be a terrible idea.”	<p>Here are three child-friendly arguments you might use to help Amy understand why getting a cat might not be the best idea:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Playtime Limitations: “Amy, cats often like to be on their own and may not always want to play when you want to. This means they might not be around to play games or cuddle when you feel like it.” 2. You will get more out of AI tools if you provide longer prompts, giving as much context as possible on the question you're asking.

1.3 Outputs

When you ask a question of an AI tool, you can be specific about what format the response should take. Here are 4 different formats for the answer to *Why is Die Hard a Christmas film?*:

1.4 Audience

When asking a question, it's often useful to specify the audience – here is ChatGPT trying to explain to 3 very different audiences why they should watch the Netflix series *Gilmore Girls*:

Audience	Prompt	Answer
<i>Communists</i>	“You are giving a lecture to a group of young communists. Summarise in no more than 50 words why you think they should watch the <i>Gilmore Girls</i> .”	Watching “ <i>Gilmore Girls</i> ” offers insights into the interplay of class dynamics, personal aspirations, and societal expectations. Its portrayal of community and individual struggles within a capitalist framework can spark dialogue on social mobility and solidarity, making it relevant and thought-provoking for young communists seeking to understand and challenge societal structures.
<i>Wedding guests</i>	“You have been asked to do the best man's speech at your friend's wedding. Summarise in no more than 50 words why you think the bridegroom and bride should watch the <i>Gilmore Girls</i> .”	As the best man, I'd recommend watching <i>Gilmore Girls</i> for its witty dialogue and heartwarming portrayal of relationships. It's a masterclass in communication and connection, offering both laughter and lessons, perfect for fostering understanding and joy in your new journey together.
<i>Primary school children</i>	“You have been asked to give a guest speech at your children's primary school. The children in the class will be boys and girls between the ages of 5 and 12. Summarise in no more than 50 words why you think they should watch the <i>Gilmore Girls</i> .”	<i>Gilmore Girls</i> offers fun and heartfelt stories that teach the importance of family, friendship, and community. It encourages everyone to support each other, dream big, and cherish every moment together—lessons valuable for kids as they grow and learn about the world around them.

Note that the audience doesn't change the style of the answer; just the words used.

1.5 Roles

You can ask an AI tool to play a *role* when answering a question (guiding it as to which information it should give most weight). Here are 4 examples asking the same question to different “people”:


Role	Prompt	Answer
<i>Conspiracy theorist</i>	“You are a slightly bitter person who thinks that often the world is out to get you. You suspect that the moon landings were staged and that JFK was shot by the CIA. In 50 words or less give your opinion on whether the BBC should be funded by a licence fee or not in the UK.”	The BBC licence fee is just another method to enforce payment for media that pushes whatever agenda they want. If they were truly about the public's interest, funding should come from advertisements or subscriptions, not from taxing everyone regardless of whether they watch it or not. It's all control.
<i>Liberal</i>	“You read the Guardian and always vote for the Liberal Democrats. In 50 words or less give your opinion on whether the BBC should be funded by a licence fee or not in the UK.”	The BBC licence fee is crucial for maintaining independent, high-quality broadcasting free from commercial pressures. It supports diverse and educational content accessible to all, reflecting values we should preserve. Public funding ensures the BBC remains a trusted and impartial national resource.
<i>Modern teenager</i>	“You are a teenager who gets all of your news from TikTok. You can't remember the last time you watched television. In 50 words or less give your opinion on whether the BBC should be funded by a licence fee or not in the UK.”	Honestly, who even watches TV anymore? We get all our updates from TikTok and other apps. Charging for a TV licence seems so old-school. Maybe the BBC should find a way to stay relevant and fund itself without needing a licence fee from people who don't use it.
<i>Jane Austen</i>	“You are Jane Austen. In 50 words or less give your opinion on whether the BBC should be funded by a licence fee or not in the UK.”	As Jane Austen, I might say: “Public funding via licence ensures the BBC remains a cultural beacon, free from commercial pressures. This model safeguards impartiality and quality, preserving British heritage and fostering informed citizens. A worthy investment for society's enlightenment and entertainment.”




Giving your AI tool a role to play is a way of telling it which information in its database should be given most weight. A climatologist and a conspiracy theorist would draw on very different sources to answer questions about climate change.

1.6 Style


A caveman, advertising executive and teenager might well style their responses to question such as *Why isn't Die Hard a Christmas film?* in very different ways:



“Caveman say, big fire, loud bangs, no quiet snow. No sing songs or give gifts. Just man fight. Where tree? Where family? Not like winter feast.”



“Clearly, "Die Hard" lacks the festive branding—no heartfelt joy or reindeer. It's action-packed, sure, but it's missing that quintessential Christmas spirit and family warmth.”



Mate, "Die Hard" is just some mad action with guns and explosions. It's not about Christmas vibes or hanging with the fam. Not a holiday film, innit?

As the above examples show, when you ask a question of an AI tool you have complete control over the style in which it answers it! Here are some examples of styles that you could specify:

In the style of ...	Response
... a badly educated person	Die Hard ain't a Christmas movie 'cause it's all about shooting and saving folks, not about Christmas stuff like Santa or presents. Just 'cause it's snowing don't mean it's festive.
... a rapper	Yo, Die Hard ain't Christmas, it's action packed, No Santa, just McClane attackin' back. It's in the season, but not the reason, More about survival, less holiday pleasin'.
... Adele	"Die Hard" might be set at Christmas, darling, but it's all about action and thrill, not the heartfelt warmth and joy that truly make a film feel like Christmas.

1.7 Examples

Giving examples to an AI tool is an excellent way of guiding it towards the sort of answer you're looking for without having to give lots of detailed explanation. Here are a couple of examples:

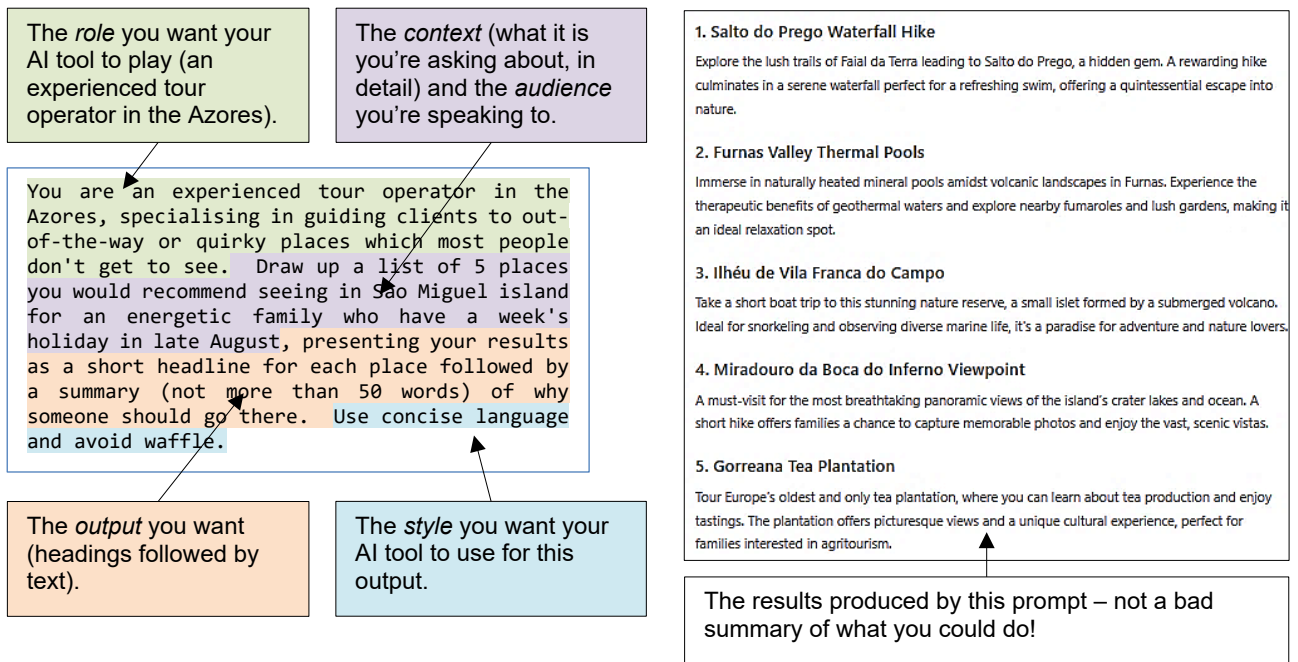
Notice how the AI tool has produced some better answers than the original examples, but also some much worse ones (and one – TITANIC – which doesn't work). As always, it's up to you then to decide what you want to include!

1.8 Putting Everything Together

This section gives some examples of prompt engineering.

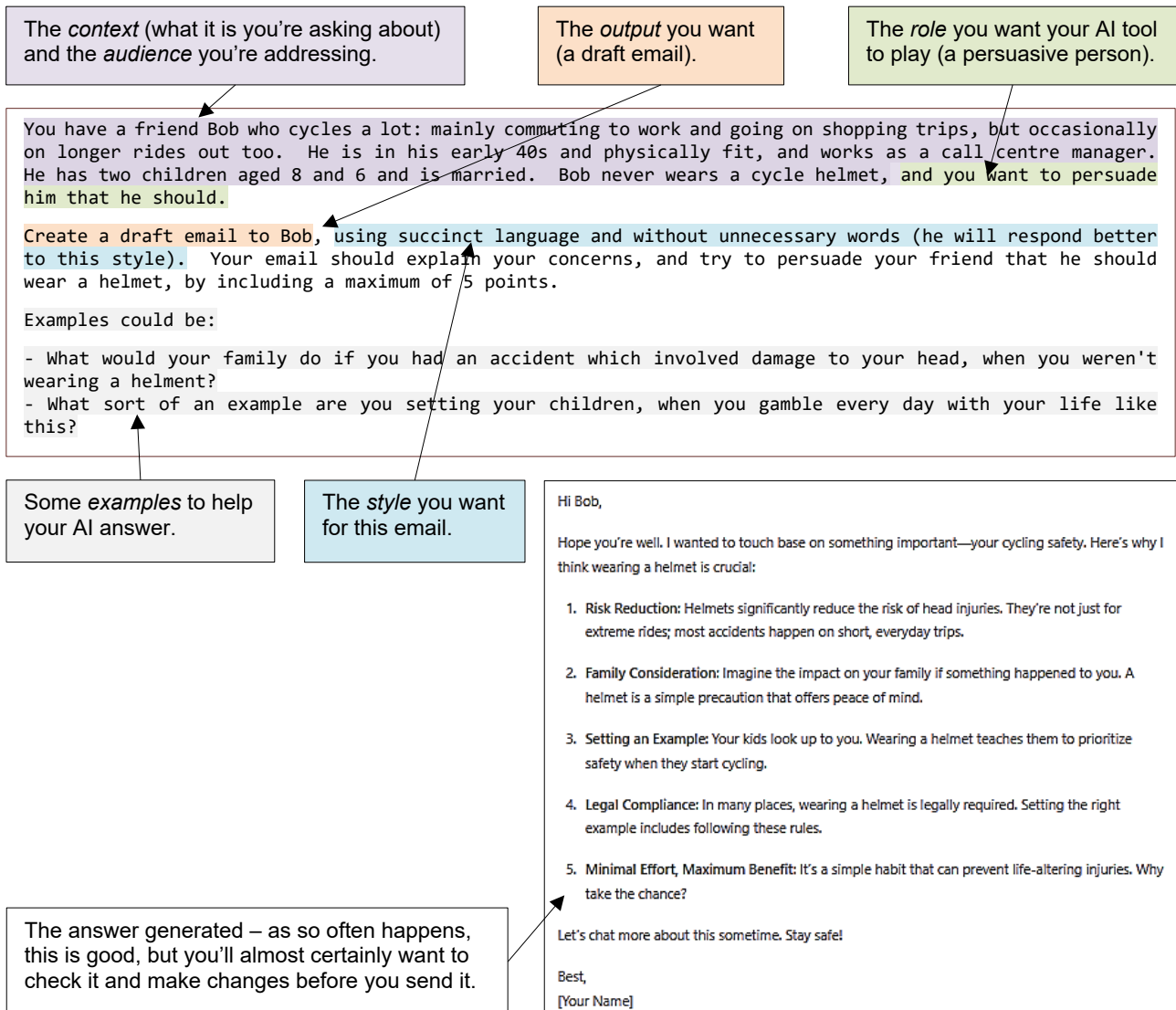
Example 1 – Planning a Holiday

You and your family are planning a week's holiday in the Azores, but need help planning an itinerary:



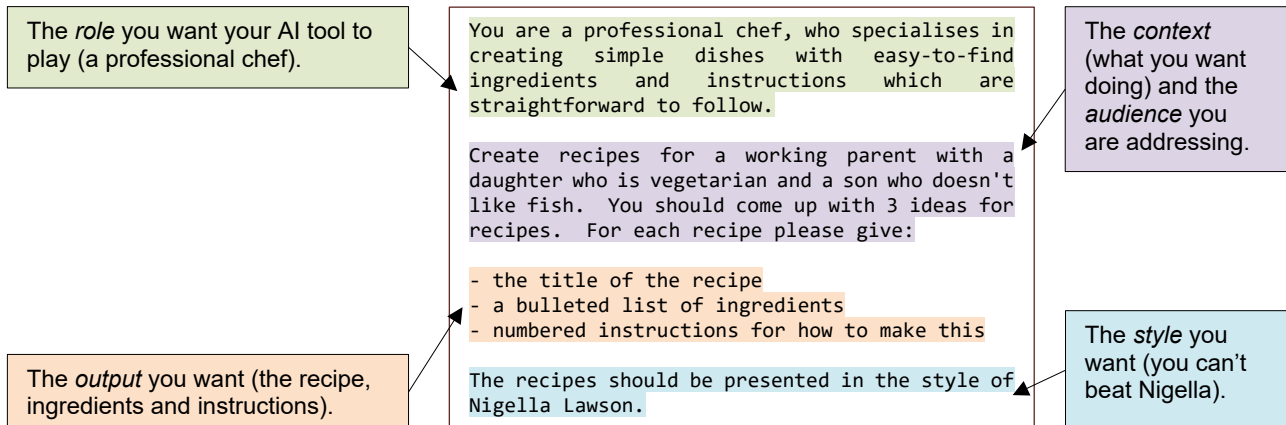
Example 2 – Persuading a Friend to Wear a Cycle Helmet

Your friend Bob refuses to wear a cycle helmet, and you want to compose an email to persuade him that he should do so:

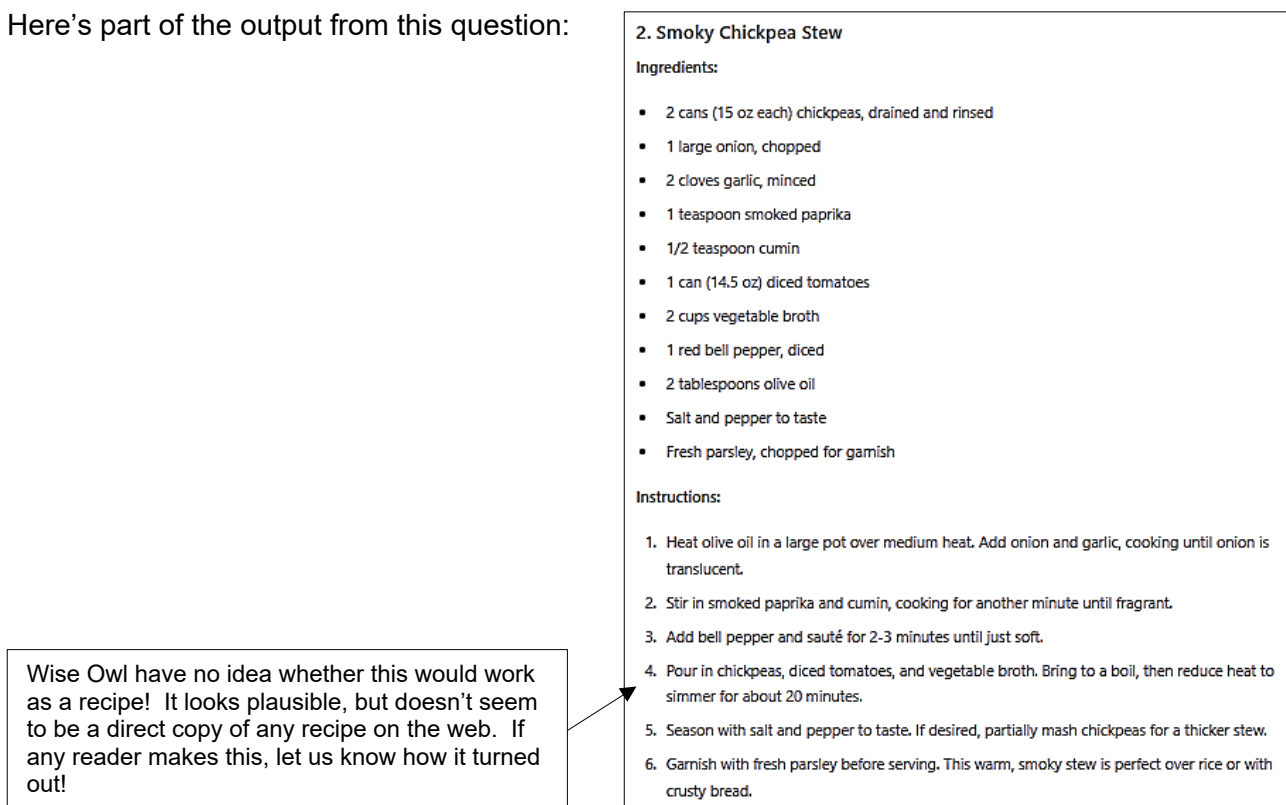


Example 3 – Suggesting Recipes

CHAPTER 2 - PUTTING THE CHAT IN CHATGPT

This chapter explains how you can have conversations with AI tools in general (and specifically with ChatGPT, whose name begins with **Chat** for a reason!).

2.1 Repeating Questions

Asking ChatGPT (and presumably other AI tools) to try again shouldn't work ... but does. Consider this attempt to summarise the plot of *The Sound of Music*:

It's debatable which of the answers is the best one, but they are definitely distinct from each other!



In fact all that you have to do to get a different answer is to refresh the screen. Because AI tools use probability to generate their answers, you'll almost certainly get a different answer each time.

2.2 Pausing Conversations

You can ask ChatGPT to pause answers until you're ready to continue, as this example shows:

List the 50 best Beatles songs in order. List the songs in batches of 10, starting with numbers 50 to 41 and finishing with the top 10. Present your results as a table with headings "Song Title" and "Main composer" (this should be a single individual where known - so for example even though "Girl" was credited to Lennon/McCartney, it was John Lennon who composed it. **Pause after each batch of 10 songs.**)

Here we've asked ChatGPT to pause after each batch of 10 songs.

Let's continue with the next batch.



To continue, you normally need to type into the prompt one of the following phrases:

- Keep going
- Continue
- Carry on

If this button appears you can sometimes click on this to continue.

Here are the top 10 Beatles songs, showcasing the pinnacle of their songwriting and musical innovation:

This list of the top 10 encapsulates some of the most memorable and influential songs by The Beatles, each a testament to their profound impact on music and culture.

Not a bad list, although (as ChatGPT warned at the beginning of its output) this sort of thing is subjective. It's impressive how ChatGPT has assigned the correct composer to each song, insofar as this is known or possible (John Lennon wrote the tuneful bit at the start of *A Day in the Life*, for example).

2.3 Expanding on Answers

This shows how you can get the most value out of an AI tool, by asking it to expand on or develop previous answers.



There's a Chat at the start of ChatGPT for a reason! It's designed to be used as part of a conversation, in which ChatGPT remembers what both parties to the conversation have said previously and builds upon this.

Drilling Down

One of the most common uses of ChatGPT is to come up with a list of ideas or suggestions, then ask for more detail on one or two of them. For example you might get a list of film suggestions:

You're a professional middle-aged man looking to watch a film. You don't like anything too violent. Come up with a suggestion of 5 films which you could watch tonight, giving the title of each and a summary (not more than 20 words). Present this information in a table with two columns heading "Film title" and "Summary".

This prompt is designed to give the author (*professional* is probably stretching it, as is *middle-aged*) some suggestions for films to watch.

I think I've seen the first two, but the middle one sounds interesting.

Here are five film suggestions that offer engaging stories with minimal violence, perfect for a relaxing movie night:

Film Title	Summary
<i>Amélie</i>	A whimsical Parisian woman seeks to improve the lives around her through small, secret acts of kindness.
<i>The Grand Budapest Hotel</i>	A colorful tale of a legendary concierge at a famous European hotel between the wars.

<i>The Secret Life of Walter Mitty</i>	A day-dreamer embarks on a worldwide adventure, turning his life into a grand, real-life adventure.

These films provide a blend of humor, adventure, and heartwarming moments, suitable for a peaceful evening.

You could then dig down into more detail on one of them:

Tell me more about the third film (who appears in it, who directed it, etc)

This follow-up question elicits more background to this film.

You could now ask about other films in the list, or perhaps ask about some of the actors or directors mentioned in this review.

Finding Forrester, directed by Gus Van Sant and released in 2000, is a drama film that delves into themes of mentorship, friendship, and the power of writing. It stars Sean Connery as William Forrester, a reclusive, Pulitzer Prize-winning novelist who forges an unlikely friendship with a prodigious young writer from the Bronx, Jamal Wallace, played by Rob Brown.

The film explores the dynamics between the two as Forrester becomes Jamal's mentor, helping him refine his writing skills and navigate the complexities of academic and personal challenges. The story highlights the impact of a mentor in unleashing one's potential and the bonds that can form over shared passions.

Finding Forrester is noted for its strong performances, particularly Connery's portrayal of the enigmatic and brilliant Forrester. The film also features a supporting cast including F. Citing Sources

This only works well for factual information:

Is it true that chewing-gum loses its flavour if left out overnight (for example, on a bedpost)? Please summarise your results in about 25 words, avoiding jargon or filler words and using concise language.

Yes, chewing gum can lose its flavor if left out overnight due to the evaporation of flavoring agents and moisture loss.

ChatGPT will often voluntarily include its sources in any factual response, but where it doesn't do this you can always ask for them!

Note that sometimes ChatGPT will show them automatically:

As of 2024, the three companies in the UK with the highest market capitalisation are:

This is excellent transparency: you can see the sites that ChatGPT searched (the answer credits **Disfold** at the bottom, with a link to it).

2.4 ChatGPT Memory

ChatGPT has – by its own admission – a short-term memory problem:

How big is your memory when answering questions? How many tokens can you remember?

As an AI, I have a short-term memory that can typically handle a context window of about 8,000 tokens, which includes both the input (your questions and prompts) and my responses. This allows me to maintain context and coherence over a conversation or a series of questions within that limit. If the conversation exceeds this limit, older information may be lost or forgotten. If you need me to recall specific details from earlier parts of our conversation, you might need to provide some context again.

ChatGPT will remember the last few thousand words in your prompts, but won't remember things you asked it before that.

To give an idea of the scope of ChatGPT's memory, here's what it can remember about our conversations today:

AI tools are stateless. What this means is that whenever you ask a question it sends a summary of any previous conversations you've had recently at the same time. If you want an AI tool to ignore any previous conversations you've had you should open a new conversation window.

2.5 Requesting a Q&A Session

Obviously you can ask ChatGPT questions, but it can also reciprocate! For example:

We are a small computer training company in the UK, with intelligent and possibly slightly impatient staff who enjoy quirky humour but also enjoy learning new things. I want to create an interesting presentation to show at our next company day. The presentation should be short (no more than 15 minutes). Ask me a series of up to 5 questions about this, pausing after each question, then come up with some suggested topics for my presentation in the form of a table with two columns: "Idea" and "Details". Be concise, and don't include more than 20 words for the details for each idea.

Sure, let's start with the first question:

1. What specific topics or themes are currently relevant or of interest to your staff in the field of computer training?

It doesn't have to be in the field of computer training - could be anything of general interest too

Great, that gives us more flexibility. Next question:

2. Are there any recent achievements or milestones in your company that you'd like to highlight or celebrate in the presentation?

Here we've asked ChatGPT to pause after asking each question.

This is the first question. It's sometimes useful to be grilled like this, but only if you can come up with helpful answers!

At the end of the 5 questions, here are the topics that ChatGPT came up with:

These are all reasonably good ideas – particularly as I wasn't that helpful in my replies to questions.



This is a useful technique to employ when you want to provide the context to a question, but aren't exactly sure what you want to ask.
